REMARKS: 'Age of Arthur' page 54 states: "early tradition is that Coel ruled the whole of the north, south of the Wall, the territory that the Notitia assigned to the dux;.....he was the last Roman commander, who turned his command to a kingdom.....medieval fantasy turned him into Old King Cole, and on the strength of the name transferred him to Colchester."

REMARKS: 'Age of Arthur' page 213 states: "Coel's wife, Stradwawl (Wall Road) and his daughter Gwawl (The Wall), named as the wife of Cunedda, confirm his date, and show that his authority was held to have extended to Hadrian's Wall."

REMARKS: 'Welsh Classical Dictionary' page 136 states: "earliest versions of his genealogy we find "Coel Hen ap Godebog ap Tegfan" (HG 10, VCadoci 46b, JC5 in EWGT pp. 10, 25, 44). All later versions, however, drop the cognomen "Hen" and treat "Godebog" as the cognomen of Coel (GaC2, MG 1, ABT 1c in EWGT pp. 36, 38, 96).....Ifor Williams pointed out that Godebog, earlier Guotepauc, as in HG 10, was indisputably a Brythonic epithet, derived from Votepacos.....Idris Foster translated it "shelterer, protector, defender" in 'Prehistoric and Early Wales'."

REMARKS: "Coel Hen appears in the Harleian genealogies and the later pedigrees known as the Bonedd Gwyr y Gogledd (The Descent of the Men of the North) at the head of several post-Roman royal families of the Hen Ogledd. His line, collectively called the Coeling, included such noted figures as Urien, king of Rheged; Gwallog, perhaps king of Elmet; the brothers Gwrgi and Peredur, and Clydno Eiddin, king of Eiddin or Edinburg. He was also considered to be the father-in-law of Cunedda, founder of Gwynedd in North Wales, by his daughter Gwawl. The genealogies give him the epithet Godebog, meaning "Protector" or "Shelterer". The poem Y Gododdin mentions some enmity between the "Sons of Godebog" and the heroes who fought for the Gododdin at the Battle of Catraeth. As an ancestor figure, Coel Hen compares to Dumnagual Hen, who is likewise attributed with founding kingly lines in the Hen Ogledd. According to Welsh tradition the region of Kyle was named for Coel, and a mound at Coylton in Argyll was regarded as his tomb. Projections back from dated individuals suggest that Coel Hen lived around AD 350-420, during the time of the Roman departure from Britain. In his widely-criticized book The Age of Arthur, historian John Morris suggested that Coel may have been the last of the Roman Duces Britanniarum (Dukes of the Britons) who commanded the Roman army in northern Britain. According to Morris he may have taken over the northern capital at Eburacum (York) to rule over what had been the northern province of Roman Britain. Upon Coel Hen's death, his lands would have been split between his sons, Garmonion and Cunedda II, and later his grandsons, Dunwal Moelmut, Cunedda III, and Gwrwst Ledlwn, thus creating the many old northern kingdoms of Britain. 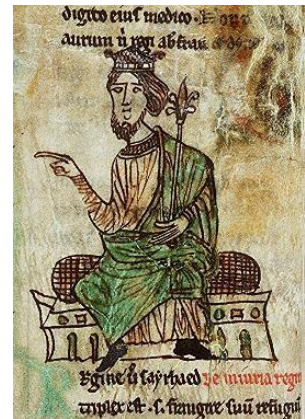

Gerald de Windsor (1070 -1136), also known as Gerald FitzWalter, Constable of Pembroke Castle from 1102, was the nobleman in charge of the Norman forces in Wales in the late 11th century. Notably, he was the progenitor of the FitzGerald and de Barry dynasties of Ireland. These celebrated HibernoNorman or Cambro-Norman families, have been Peers of Ireland since the 14th Century at least. Gerald was the son of Walter FitzOtho by his wife Beatrice. FitzOtho became Constable of Windsor Castle immediately upon its completion by William I of England.[1] Gerald's grandfather was Otho, owner of manors in five English counties. Gerald married Nest ferch Rhys, Princess of Deheubarth, who was the daughter of Prince Rhys ap Tewdwr and Gwladys ferch Rhiwallon ap Cynfyn, around 1095.

He married first, Cecily, daughter of Sir Walter Maney, Knight, and had:

11 Sir Thomas Gerard, Second Baronet of Bryn, who married Frances, daughter of Sir Richard Molyneux, First Baronet of Sefton, and sister of 1st Viscount Molyneux, and had:

John, Peter and Gilbert, who are said to have died unmarried [see William Playfair], Frances, who became a Nun. William, the 3rd Baronet, who married Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Cuthbert Clifton, Knight, **Thomas (below)**, Richard [1612-1686], Anne, who married 1st Cox and 2nd Thomas Green, who came on the Ark and Dove to Maryland in 1634 and was governor of the province. He was married three times, first to Elizabeth, sister of Leonard Calvert, 2nd to Anne, and 3rd to the widow, Winifred Seyborne.

The Math of Ancestry

Each of us have in the first generation back 2 ancestors – Mother and Father, the list below shows the progression of our number of direct ancestors in each generation.

1st generation = 2 ancestors

2nd generation = 4 ancestors

3rd generation = 8 ancestors

4th generation = 16 ancestors

5th generation = 32 ancestors

10th generation = 1024 ancestors

20th generation = 1,048,576 1 Million ancestors

40th generation = 1,099,511,647,130 1 Trillion ancestors - approx. year 1,000 AD

50th generation = 1,125,899,931,620,000 1,125 Trillion ancestors – approx. year 750 AD

Pop. of Earth 1000 AD = 275 million

Pop. of Earth 750 AD = 220 Million

Pop. of Earth Today = 7.146 billion

The above statistics make evident that there were not enough people in the distant past for our ancestors to be biologically unrelated to each other.
